



## **NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL IMPLEMENTATION MEMORANDUM**

NSC-IM-IAC-01

*Subject: Establishment of the Interagency Accord Commission (IAC)*

March 18, 2026

### **I. Purpose**

This Implementation Memorandum provides direction for the coordination and execution of national security activities associated with the establishment of the Interagency Accord Commission (IAC). The Commission will serve as a strategic interagency coordination body responsible for advancing United States national security priorities through integrated policy coordination, strategic planning, and interagency collaboration.

### **II. Policy**

It is the policy of the United States to ensure that emerging strategic challenges—including counterproliferation, transnational threats, advanced technology competition, and strategic scientific development—are addressed through coordinated interagency action.

To facilitate this objective, the Interagency Accord Commission (IAC) is established as a policy coordination and strategic planning body operating in support of the National Security Council (NSC).

The IAC will provide an institutional framework for interagency cooperation, strategic research oversight, and policy coordination across departments and agencies responsible for national security.



### III. Establishment

1. The Interagency Accord Commission (IAC) is hereby established as a national-level interagency coordination initiative supporting the National Security Council.
2. The Commission will function as a strategic policy coordination body responsible for:
  - o Interagency strategic planning
  - o Coordination of national security research and development initiatives
  - o Counterproliferation policy coordination
  - o Export control and compliance coordination
  - o Integration of advanced technological capabilities relevant to national security
3. The Commission will coordinate with departments and agencies across the Executive Branch consistent with applicable laws and authorities.

### IV. Organizational Structure

The Interagency Accord Commission shall operate under the following structure:

President of the Commission

Responsible for strategic guidance and senior advisory coordination.

Vice President / Executive Director

Responsible for day-to-day operations, interagency coordination, and implementation of Commission initiatives.

Directorates

The Commission will initially organize activities through the following functional directorates:

1. Counterproliferation
2. Counter-Drug Operations
3. Export Control and Compliance
4. Advanced Systems Research and Development Oversight
5. Operations and Unmanned Systems Coordination



Additional directorates may be established as necessary to support national security priorities.

## V. Interagency Coordination

Departments and agencies participating in national security activities are encouraged to cooperate with the Commission, consistent with applicable authorities and statutory responsibilities.

The Commission may establish interagency working groups, advisory panels, and cooperative frameworks to support coordination and information sharing.

## VI. Oversight and Ethics

All activities undertaken by the Commission shall comply with:

- Applicable federal laws and regulations
- Intelligence oversight requirements
- Privacy and civil liberties protections
- Federal ethics and conflict-of-interest standards

The Commission shall maintain internal governance policies to ensure transparency, accountability, and professional conduct among its personnel and stakeholders.

## VII. Reporting

The Commission shall provide periodic strategic assessments and recommendations to the National Security Council concerning emerging national security challenges, interagency coordination priorities, and strategic technology initiatives.



An annual strategic report summarizing Commission activities and recommendations shall be prepared for review by the National Security Advisor.

#### VIII. Effective Date

This memorandum is effective immediately upon issuance.
